## **Report on the Full Council Meeting held on 6<sup>th</sup> May 2006**

The following proposal was carried that "Council accept in principle that any junior who is in full time education at the time he goes from junior to senior can become a senior at the junior rate of subscription until such times as he finishes that specific course".

The following proposal was carried that " The Trophy Repair Fund be maintained at a level of five thousand pounds, by annual transfer from the General Fund, with a limit of seven hundred and fifty pounds in any financial year. This change should be retrospective to the financial year ending March 2005".

Post meeting note, due to accounts being finalised for audit purposes, this will not be applied retrospectively.

The following proposal was carried that "Council makes available to the Achievement Scheme Review Committee (ASRC) an additional budget of £2000 for the financial year 2006-2007 to be ring fenced specifically for use by the committee to fund the travel and other expenses of Committee members in their work with the Examiner and Chief Examiner training days and Seminars that Area Committees are starting to arrange and run.

The appropriate BMFA budget heading in which to record this would be 'Training and Excellence', which is a heading that is already active".

The following proposal was carried that "The original budget of £1372 for Training and Excellence is double to £2744".

The following proposal was carried that "This Council adopt the rules governing the nomination of candidates for the Society's Awards."

The following proposal was carried that "This Association adopts a proposed method that individual club members, country members, Fellows and Honorary Members are eligible to vote for the election of Officers".

### **Team Managers**

Rob Ashley-Roche was ratified as F5D Team Manager for the forthcoming World Championships.

Alison Harrop was appointed as F3A Team Manager for the 2006 season.

### **Trophies**

The following proposal was carried that "The Davies B Trophy, currently awarded for 'B' Team Race at the Power Nationals, be re-allocated to Barton 'B' Team Race at the Nationals."

The following proposal was carried that "Anyone working on behalf of the BMFA and having written or verbal contact with outside authorities or organisations, e.g. local or national government, MPs, or press, should always use consistent and full descriptions of the type of model aircraft or flying in question, for example, 'free flight model', 'radio-controlled model', 'control line model', 'silent radio-controlled model'."

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## **Report on the Areas Council Meeting held on 10<sup>th</sup> June 2006**

Two proposals were put forward "That in the Helicopter 'B' Certificate test, the Hovering 'M' be deleted and replaced with the 'Pilot's Pirouette'." Also "That in the Helicopter 'B' certificate, the Hovering 'M' be deleted and replaced with a 'Double Hovering Pirouette'."

There was a lengthy debate and the following proposal was carried "To remain with the status quo with the Hovering 'M' as it currently features with the minimum safety distances."

Numerous proposals were carried as follows:

"That the following section be added to both the Helicopter 'A' and 'B' Standards documents".

Throughout the duration of the test the pilot should be aware of the movement of other users on the site. This is extremely important and any pilot who initiates a manoeuvre that may endanger another site user or who fails to notice the movement of people who might be putting themselves into danger should be failed.

Any candidate who decides to abort a manoeuvre to avoid any unexpected and unforeseen movement of other site users should not be penalised and, at the examiner's discretion, should be allowed to continue the test as soon as it is safe to do so.

"That all references to the wind direction should be removed from both the helicopter 'A' and 'B' tests and the helicopter 'A' and 'B' standards documents".

“That where directions are given to the candidate to position from one manoeuvre to another in the Helicopter ‘B’ standards document, these should be omitted”.

“That the Single Stall Turn in the Helicopter ‘B’ certificate be deleted and replaced with a Figure of Eight, at circuit height with the crossover in front of the pilot (wording for the Helicopter ‘B’ Standards document attached).”

“That the distances in the Top Hat manoeuvre description and diagram in the Helicopter ‘B’ Certificate Standards document be increased to 10m long and 4m high for the central part of the manoeuvre.”

“That the ‘C’ Certificate (Fixed Wing) is re-named to be the ‘C’ Certificate (Aerobatics). The date of inception to be as soon as the office database can be modified to accept the new designation.”

“That a new level of tested Instructor be instituted in the BMFA Instructor Scheme, the Qualified Instructor (QI) (FW). The criteria for this grade of instructor will be that they have been an Approved Instructor for one year and that they have held a relevant ‘B’ certificate for six months. The QI will be automatic on satisfying both of these requirements.”

“That the following changes be made to the Achievement Scheme re-test regulations for both ‘A’, ‘B’ and ‘E’ and Instructor re-tests. Please note that only paragraph (1) of the relevant sections is altered so that the rest of each of the sections is not shown.

#### ‘A’, ‘B’ and ‘E’ CERTIFICATE RE-TESTS

(1) Any Club or Area may apply to their local Achievement Scheme Co-ordinator (ASC) to have any member re-tested for ‘A’, ‘B’ or ‘E’ certificates. **Requests from a Club must be on Club headed notepaper and must be signed by at least two current Club Committee members. Requests from an Area must be on Area headed Notepaper and signed by at least two current Officers of the Area.**

#### APPROVED INSTRUCTOR RE-TESTS

(1) Any Club or Area may apply to their local Achievement Scheme Co-ordinator (ASC) to have any Approved Instructor re-tested. **Requests from a Club must be on Club headed notepaper and must be signed by at least two current Club Committee members. Requests from an Area must be on Area headed Notepaper and signed by at least two current Officers of the Area.**

“That the following paragraph is added to both the Helicopter ‘A’ certificate and Helicopter ‘B’ certificate tests.”

**The test flight must be made outdoors. No artificial stabilisation is allowed other than a tail rotor gyro and helicopters with contra-rotating coaxial main rotors may not be used.**

“That version 5 of the ‘A’ Certificate (Fixed Wing) Standards Document be accepted.”

“That version 4 of the ‘B’ Certificate (Fixed Wing) Standards Document be accepted.”

“That version 5 of the ‘A’ Certificate (Helicopter) Standards Document be accepted. This is with the proviso that this meeting has proposals before it that will change certain aspects of the Standards Document when decisions on them are finally made.”

“That draft version 1 of the ‘A’ Certificate (Silent Flight – Thermal) Standards Document be accepted.”

“That draft version 1 of the ‘B’ Certificate (Silent Flight – Thermal) Standards Document be accepted.”

“That draft version 1 of the ‘A’ Certificate (Silent Flight – Slope) Standards Document be accepted.”

“That draft version 1 of the ‘B’ Certificate (Silent Flight – Slope) Standards Document be accepted.”

“That draft version 1 of the ‘A’ Certificate (Silent Flight - Electric) Standards Document be accepted.”

“That draft version 1 of the ‘B’ Certificate (Silent Flight – Electric) Standards Document be accepted.”

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## Latest Changes to the Achievement Schemes

Areas Council on 10<sup>th</sup> June, 2006 voted in various changes and additions to the Achievement Schemes which are detailed below. Most of these are within the Helicopter scheme so I'll deal with these first.

### **The Helicopter 'A' and 'B' Certificates.**

- (1) The following section has been added to the Standards notes.  
'Throughout the duration of the test the pilot should be aware of the movement of other users on the site. This is extremely important and any pilot who initiates a manoeuvre that may endanger another site user or who fails to notice the movement of people who might be putting themselves into danger should be failed. Any candidate who decides to abort a manoeuvre to avoid any unexpected and unforeseen movement of other site users should not be penalised and, at the examiner's discretion, should be allowed to continue the test as soon as it is safe to do so'.
- (2) All references to the wind direction have been removed from both the test and the Standards booklets.
- (3) All tests for the Helicopter 'A' and 'B' must now take place outdoors.
- (4) All Helicopter tests now specify that no artificial stabilisation is allowed other than a tail rotor gyro.
- (5) Helicopters with coaxial contra-rotating main rotors may not now be used to take the tests.

### **The Helicopter 'A' Certificate Only.**

As a reminder, don't forget that in February the Helicopter 'A' test was altered to delete the hovering 'L' and introduce a hovering 'T'.

The definition of the Hovering 'Lazy Eight' was also tightened up to insist that the model is being flown forwards at all times during the manoeuvre

### **The Helicopter 'B' Certificate Only.**

- (1) There were proposals to replace the Hovering 'M' with a different manoeuvre but it was decided to leave the Hovering 'M' in the test and add more safety information to the Standards booklet.
- (2) The Single Stall Turn, however, has been deleted and replaced with a circuit height figure eight, flown in much the same way as the eight in the Fixed Wing 'B'. In other words, it's not a hovering manoeuvre. This will come into effect in 1<sup>st</sup> September, 2006, and all Examiners and Chief Examiners should take notice of this.
- (3) It was decided that all references to flight pattern between manoeuvres should be removed, so this area is now something that the candidate has to decide themselves and is another thing that the Examiners can use to make their judgements.
- (4) The distances in the 'Top Hat' have been increased to 4 metres high and 10 metres long in the central part of the manoeuvre.

### **The 'C' Certificate, Fixed Wing C(FW).**

This has been re-named as the 'C' Certificate, Aerobatics C(AE).

## **'A', 'B' and 'E' Certificate and Approved Instructor Re-tests**

The rules about these state that requests for re-tests must be passed to your local Area Achievement Scheme Co-ordinator. To clarify this, the following section has been added.

'Requests from a Club must be on Club headed notepaper and must be signed by at least two current Club Committee members. Requests from an Area must be on Area headed Notepaper and signed by at least two current Officers of the Area'.

## **The Instructor Scheme**

You will recall that the requirement for all new Approved Instructor candidates to have held a relevant 'A' certificate for at least six months was introduced in February of this year.

A new level has now been introduced into the Instructor scheme with a view to encouraging instructors to take further qualifications without insisting that they do so.

The new level is the Qualified Instructor (QI).

Ratification as a QI is automatic and there is no test to take but you must comply with two conditions:

- (1) You must have held an Approved Instructor rating for a minimum of one year.
- (2) You must have held the relevant 'B' certificate for at least six months.

As you can see, this means that you get the new rating automatically if you already meet these criteria.

However, you also get the QI rating after six months if you are already an Approved Instructor and then take your 'B' certificate

OR  
you will get the QI rating after a year if you are already a 'B' Certificate holder and you take an Approved Instructor test.

## **The Test Standards Booklets**

We now have the full range of Test Standards Booklets with the introduction of new documents covering the 'A' and 'B' tests in Silent Flight Thermal, Slope and Electric.

We've also taken the opportunity to upgrade the Fixed Wing and Helicopter booklets too so every document is either new or freshly re-issued.

They are all available on the BMFA website; look at the drop down menus under Resources/Achievement Schemes.

The Leicester Office also carries stocks that are available free of charge and they will be available on the BMFA Publicity Stand at all the shows it visits throughout the year.
