Please refer to the balance sheets provided tonight, it shows the predicted balance of **£3464.29** as at the end of March with the cost of tonight's venue and the money we are holding for the Odiham Rally withdrawn. An increase of **£268.51** over the previous year's total.

These are the figures have been presented to the BMFA HO together with the AGM minutes as required to qualify for the 2018 grant.

Notes on the accounts:

1. I have spent some time on the presented accounts to delete the 04/2014 – 03/2015 period to make room for the 04/2018 – 03/2019, this now shows the anticipated income and expenditure for the coming accounting period. The second page which shows the details of the accounts have however been retained and go back to when I took over the accounts in 2011.

2. The 2018 Balsa Brain event has been budgeted to cost the Area around £385.00 but following the expected raffle and entry fee collections I anticipate the actual cost will be in the region of £235.00, similar to the 2017 event.
3. The usual subsidies to CADMAC and Waltham Chase will be continued at a cost of £200.00.
4. As can be seen we are holding £125.00 for the 2018 Odiham Rally that was deposited after last year's event.

5.4 Peter Turley Hon. Sec. report.

Supported the visit to the Bovington Tank Museum in October and ran the indoor stand, taking some models along, including a GWS A10. Unfortunately the Flight simulator was not available.

I took the Southern Area Flight Simulator to the Chichester Club meeting in January.

The BMFA has been working with Paul Tallett of Progression Marketing to improve external visibility and build links with partner organisations. This has been very successful, for example building links with the RAF, Melton Mowbray Council (for the Buckminster project), and industry support (e.g. Payload Challenge). A contract for the next 15 months was agreed at the meeting.

Support for competition flyers

Paul Lomax, treasurer, confirmed that there is no objection to Areas providing financial support to members of Area clubs competing at international events, should they wish. Team managers are already fully funded.

CAA / EASA feedback

The CAA has published their drone safety document (available on the website).

No change in conventional model related airprox incidents over recent years compared with steady increase in drone related incidents.

Positive negotiations with EASA have removed the proposal to register individual aircraft, and will permit bodies like BMFA to manage pilot registration at country level. Craft capable of automatic flight (e.g. drones) are not considered to be model aircraft, so will be regulated differently. There is a potential future requirement for all aircraft, manned and unmanned; to carry some form of 'conspicuity' to enable recognition by other manned craft. Currently some manned craft, for example paragliders and balloonists, do not carry this.

Achievement Scheme

Duncan McClure was appointed as Achievement Scheme Controller, as he was the only applicant.

Submission by BMAS to Southern Area BMFA: Fiscal Year 2018

This submission is made to request financial support for BMAS hosted indoor free flight meetings, to be held at the Allendale Centre, Wimborne during 2018.

These meetings have been held monthly over the past several years & have proven to be generally popular, with a typical average attendance of around 12 flyers & 2 spectators. Flyers have been charged £5 per session, whilst spectators are charged £1.50. The meetings are the only ones held in the general area of Bournemouth.

However, there has again been a year on year increase in hall hire charges, whilst the number of flyers has marginally changed, with reducing numbers over time. The actual cost of hall hire for 2017 was £868 inclusive of a very small negotiated discount. Attendances by flyers & spectators yielded an income of £740, resulting in a loss of £128.00 subsidised from diminishing Club funds & the SABMFA grant of £100 for 2017. As the Club membership continues to drop, due to age & mortality, subscriptions from Club funds can no longer be relied upon to continue this subsidy, particularly as several of the flyers are BMFA members but not BMAS members.

The entry fee for flyers will be increased from £5 to £6 for 2018 and the number of meetings to be held in 2018 is to be reduced to nine from eleven, but it is likely that participant numbers will still decline during the year. A further increase of 8.5% for hall hire for the year has already been notified. Thus it is estimated that costs for 2018 will be approx. £837, with a predicted income of approx £675. Taking account of these circumstances, it is requested that the Southern Area of the BMFA kindly provide a modest subsidy – say £100 per annum to help balance income & expenditure, such that the meetings can continue.
